Creating life-changing opportunities



South Hampstead High School was founded in 1876 with the purpose of creating equal educational opportunity for girls from all backgrounds. Born in an era where education was often not an option for girls, South Hampstead blazed a trail for the women of the future.

Widening access to education has been at the forefront of the GDST mission since the very start. South Hampstead was founded in 1876 on the principal of providing an education for all girls regardless of means, and over the years, our community has been united in supporting bursary places.


Through your generosity you have transformed the opportunities we can offer and since 2021, our Opening Doors Bursary Campaign has helped us to double our bursary provision. This September, twice as many pupils will attend the school with financial awards than at the start of the decade.

The impact on the school has been tangible and important for all our pupils. Diversity brings creativity, understanding and opportunity for all. It enhances the educational experience and prepares our students to thrive in a diverse and inclusive world.

Spreading the word

We continue to encourage families who might not be able to afford the fees to consider the broader education that we can offer at South Hampstead.

Our partnership work with local state schools and youth organisations creates vital links with bright young women who could benefit from a South Hampstead education and this year, we invited everyone in our community to become our Bursary Ambassadors. Our Head, Mrs Anna Paul, urged all alumnae at the Annual Reunion to use their own networks to promote the opportunity and introduce families who might be interested in the scheme.

'I remain committed to widening access and championing diversity and opportunity at the school, regardless of the challenges ahead. I am unashamed in asking for your help to spread the word about our bursaries and encourage families to join us.'

Our alumnae have spoken out about their own experiences both as mentors to our current award holders, and also to promote the campaign to others.

Alumna Chloe Tartan delivered the keynote speech to guests at our *Opening Doors* bursary dinner and then joined current pupil Neve at the GDST *Bursaries in the Spotlight* event.





Drawing on her background and subsequent career as a leading technology and sustainability expert, she reflected on her own journey at South Hampstead and the impact her bursary award has had on her life.

"I cannot stress enough how none of my achievements – my PhD from Cambridge, my work at the NASA space centre, or my current role with Accenture – could have happened without my bursary. My place at South Hampstead gave me the opportunity to fulfil my potential and completely re-define my destiny."

This year, we are delighted to introduce our first pupil Bursary Ambassador. Zarin joined South Hampstead in September 2023 with an award from the Black Heart Foundation and the Class of 2023. She is a proud advocate for the scheme and a wonderful example of someone who is embracing every opportunity. Earlier this year, she was elected as the Youth MP for Camden:

Giving generously



Alongside means-tested bursaries, our community has been extraordinarily generous in supporting those who have faced difficult circumstances.

It was emotional to say goodbye to three of our Ukrainian students at the end of the summer term. South Hampstead has embraced and supported these girls through a very challenging time:

"I am so grateful to everyone who has supported me. When I joined the school, I had no idea how lucky I was to end up here. My experience has been so different from many of the other Ukrainians I speak to, and it has really helped me to understand how remarkable South Hampstead is and how wonderful the teachers are. TEACHING & LEARNING

Supporting and enhancing our broad education



We invited all our parents to meet our new Head, Mrs Paul, over breakfast this year. She asked them to share what they love about South Hampstead, what they would change and what they would create.

It is clear that the warmth of our community comes very high on the list of things they love, equally important, is our farreaching education, beyond the curriculum and exams.

"It is the broad education at South Hampstead that makes the difference. The variety of co-curricular experiences and the sense of being free to pursue and excel at whatever you are good at means that pupils stride out with confidence into the wider world."

ACADEMIC AND CO-CURRICULAR

This year our community has helped us to fund a range of academic and co-curricular projects including the introduction of dynamic interactive maths desks and specialist teaching. Our *Experts in Residence* have included cricket coaches and debating masters who provide specialist support to our staff and help enhance education beyond the curriculum. We are excited to be welcoming a new Coder in Residence in September thanks to generous sponsorship from our community. As we look to the future, it is these acts of generosity that help us continue to provide an environment which, in the words of a Junior School parent: 'allows exploration beyond the curriculum and promotes female empowerment, confidence and self-belief.'



Helping us share and learn from others



Our partnerships with local schools and organisations create genuine opportunities for us to share best practice and for our pupils to mentor others and learn from their peers in different situations.

DEBATE HUB

The importance of communication and oracy skills in education has been highlighted as a priority by the new government. Our award-winning Debate Hub programme has already been running for three years and is funded entirely by our community.

This year, more than fifty schools and hundreds of children have joined our workshops, competitions or benefitted from the resources that are available on our website.

Our community doesn't just fund this programme but gives time and expertise to support it; we have been delighted that alumnae have returned in their university holidays to help run events including the Bingham Debating competition, our state school event. SPARKS ENRICHMENT

The Saturday Sparks enrichment programme for local state schools offers our pupils and staff the opportunity to volunteer and work with talented Year 5 pupils from local primary schools.

Thanks to funding through our partnerships programme, our staff are able to extend their own teaching in Classics, Modern Languages, Music and Sciences at partnership schools across London and beyond, not only benefitting the pupils involved but also enriching their own teaching practice.

CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT

Bringing the outside in



Project Zero is a pupil-led initiative to promote environmental responsibility, a love and respect for nature and create a culture of sustainability and wellbeing within the school.

As part of this mission, we aim to make our very urban campus as green as it can be; making the most of all our outdoor spaces and where possible, bringing the outside into the school.

Thanks to support from our parent organisations, Friends of South Hampstead and the Junior School PTA, we have been able to re-design of the Oakwood garden for our Sixth form students and fund a Forest School for the Junior School pupils. This year we are excited that, thanks to a generous donation, we have also been able to plan and implement the first part of what has become known as our 'Seventh Heaven' project:

'I am passionate about the outdoor world; ironically, I find myself in one of the most urban schools in the country, but we now have a unique opportunity to re-design and re-purpose our seventh floor to create a wonderful environment for education and wellbeing which seamlessly blends the outdoors with the inside.'

The 1876 Society, named after our founding year, recognises members of our community who pledge a regular annual gift of £1,876 or more to bursaries, or who donate the equivalent of a one-year full fee bursary place. A gift of a full seven-year bursary secures lifetime membership.

CLASS OF BURSARIES

The *Class of Bursaries* bring together alumnae from the same year group to help support our *Opening Doors Bursary* campaign.

We invite leaving parents to donate to their daughter's *Class* of bursary fund. The Black Heart Foundation has matched any contributions from parents and this year the Class of 2024 have funded a full fee bursary for a new sixth form entrant. It is a wonderful legacy to their daughter's time at the school.
